ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 9th day of July 1958:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 4 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1931, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Customs Primage (Dry Paints and Colours) Exemption Order 1958.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 11th day of July 1958.

2. The classes of goods set out in the Schedule hereto are hereby exempted from the primage duty imposed by section 4 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1931.

3. The Customs Primage (Paints and Related Products) Exemption Order 1957* is hereby amended by omitting from the Schedule so much thereof as relates to Tariff item 397 (1) (d), (g).
