**ORDER IN COUNCIL**

At the Government House at Wellington this 13th day August 1973

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Co-operative Companies Act 1956, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

**ORDER**

**1. Title**—This order may be cited as the Co-operative Poultry Processing Companies Order 1973.

**2. Interpretation**—For the purpose of this order,—

- (a) A company is a co-operative poultry processing company if—
  - (i) Its principal objects include the processing and marketing of poultry on behalf of its shareholders; and
  - (ii) At least 60 percent of its issued shares are held by persons (being persons primarily engaged in the production of eggs for sale to the public) on whose behalf the poultry is processed and marketed by the company—  
whether or not the company also has power to process poultry on behalf of persons other than its shareholders:
- (b) “Poultry” has the same meaning as it has in subsection (1) of section 2 of the Poultry Act 1968.

**3. Co-operative Companies Act 1956 to apply to co-operative poultry processing companies**—Co-operative poultry processing companies are hereby declared to be co-operative companies for the purposes of the Co-operative Companies Act 1956.
