Pursuant to section 29 of the Customs Amendment Act, 1921, as amended by section 3 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act, 1946, and to all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Customs (Aircraft) Regulations 1939, Amendment No. 1.
- 2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the Customs (Aircraft) Regulations 1939* (hereinafter called the principal regulations).
- 3. These regulations shall come into force on the day following notification in the *Gazette* of the making thereof.
- 4. Regulation 20 of the principal regulations is revoked, and the following substituted:—
- "20. The provisions of the Customs Acts and regulations with respect to—
 - "(i) Ships; and
 - "(ii) Goods and stores exported, imported, or carried in ships;

"(iii) Persons arriving from or departing for parts beyond the seas in ships;

shall, so far as they are applicable and except as they are modified by these regulations, apply to—

"(i) Aircraft; and

- "(ii) Goods and stores exported, imported, or carried in aircraft; and
- "(iii) Persons arriving from or departing for parts beyond the seas in aircraft.
- "The Minister may modify the form of any document prescribed by the Customs Regulations so as to make such form applicable to aircraft or to goods and persons carried therein."
