THE COAL-MINES REGULATIONS 1939, AMENDMENT NO. 3

ORDER IN COUNCIL

Present :

THE RIGHT HON. P. FRASER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Coal-mines Act, 1925, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Coal-mines Regulations 1939, Amendment No. 3.
2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the Coal-mines Regulations 1939 (hereinafter called the principal regulations).
3. These regulations shall come into force on the day following notification in the *Gazette* of the making thereof.
4. Clause (1) of Regulation 11 of the principal regulations is revoked and the following clause substituted therefor :—
 - “ (1) The subjects of examination for certificates as mine-surveyors shall be as follows :—
 - “ (a) *Practice of Surveying*.—Field practice ; keeping of field notes ; setting-out of curves ; plane triangulation ; connection of underground and surface surveys ; surveying of boreholes ; determination of dip and strike ; laws and regulations relating to mine surveying.
 - “ (b) *Engineering Surveying*.—Levelling ; grading ; measurement of earthworks ; plotting of longitudinal and cross sections ; stadia surveying ; barometric and other measurement of heights ; effect of curvature and refraction on heights.

“(c) *Surveying Instruments and Definitions.*—Construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments: theodolite, level, miners’ dial, compass, clinometer, barometer (mercury and aneroid), measuring-bands (effect of temperature and sag), planimeter, drawing-instruments.

“Definition of terms used in surveying practice:

“(d) *Drawing and Computations.*—Preparing plans from field notes; drawing of sections; contours; calculation of areas (rectilinear and curved); reduction of traverses to meridian and perpendicular; road secants; lettering and figuring.”

5. The principal regulations are amended by adding to paragraph (b) of clause (5) of Regulation 221 the following words: “and except when it is in his personal possession and custody, the shot-firer or other authorized person shall keep the case or box in a securely locked container approved by the Inspector and located in a safe and suitable place, and shall at all times keep the key of the container in his personal possession.”
