THE CORONERS REGULATIONS 1952, AMENDMENT NO. 1

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL
PURSUANT to the Coroners Act 1951, His Excellency the Administrator
of the Government, acting by and with the advice and consent of the
Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Coroners Regulations 1952, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Coroners Regulations 1952* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. Regulation 14 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting from subclause (1) the words "a fee of £2 2s.", and substituting the words "a fee of £3 3s., which sum shall be deemed to include payment for any conferences with the Coroner and for giving evidence at an inquest".

3. Regulation 15 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding the following proviso:—

" Provided that a medical witness whose evidence relates to a post-mortem examination performed by him shall be entitled under this regulation only to the amount by which a medical witnesses' fees payable under the said regulations in respect of the payment of Crown witnesses exceeds the sum of £1 1s."

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.]

These regulations provide for payment to a medical practitioner of a fee of £3 3s. for performing a post-mortem examination, including any consultation with the Coroner thereon and giving evidence at an inquest if necessary.
