



THE COINAGE REGULATIONS 1967, AMENDMENT NO. 11

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 20th day of September 1982

Present:

THE RIGHT HON. D. MACINTYRE PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 34 of the Decimal Currency Act 1964, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title—These regulations may be cited as the Coinage Regulations 1967, Amendment No. 11, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Coinage regulations 1967* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. 1982 Takahe Dollar—(1) Notwithstanding anything in regulation 2 (a) of the principal regulations, the design for the one-dollar coin to be known as the 1982 Takahe Dollar, to be made and issued pursuant to section 10 (1) of the Decimal Currency Act 1964, shall be as follows:

(a) For the obverse impression, the effigy of Her Majesty the Queen in profile wearing a diamond tiara, earrings, and a necklace, with the inscription "ELIZABETH II QUEEN OF NEW ZEALAND" inside a border pattern around the periphery of the coin and the date "1982" separated from the inscription by 2 florets:

(b) For the reverse impression, a takahe (*Notornis mantelli*) facing left and standing on a clump of tussock grassland, with the words "ONE DOLLAR" above and around the periphery of the coin and the word "TAKAHE" to the left of the bird.

(2) Except as aforesaid, all the provisions of the principal regulations relating to the one-dollar coin shall apply to the coin referred to in subclause (1) of this regulation.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations amend the Coinage Regulations 1967, and prescribe the design for a dollar coin to be issued in 1982 to be known as the 1982 Takahe Dollar. The design is illustrated below, being actual size reproductions of the final model for the coin before it is minted. The effigy of Her Majesty, the Berry design, was first used on the dollar coin in 1979 (see S.R. 1979/193), superseding the Machin design (see, for example, the description in S.R. 1978/137).
