ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 28th day of March 1983

THE RIGHT HON. D. MACINTYRE PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 34 of the Decimal Currency Act 1964, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. Title—These regulations may be cited as the Coinage Regulations 1967, Amendment No. 12, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Coinage Regulations 1967* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- 2. 1983 Royal Visit Commemorative Dollar—(1) Notwithstanding anything in regulation 2 (a) of the principal regulations, the design for the one-dollar coin to be known as the 1983 Royal Visit Commemorative Dollar, to be made and issued pursuant to section 10 (1) of the Decimal Currency Act 1964, shall be as follows:

- (a) For the obverse impression the effigy of Her Majesty the Queen in profile wearing a diamond tiara of festoons, scrolls, and collet spikes, and around the periphery of the coin appear the inscriptions "ELIZABETH II" to the left of the effigy and "NEW ZEALAND" to the right of the effigy, with the date "1983" below the effigy:
- (b) For the reverse impression the conjoined effigies of Their Royal Highnesses the Prince and Princess of Wales facing right, with the Prince of Wales' Badge of Ostrich Feathers to the left of the effigies and a New Zealand Silver Fern frond to the right of the effigies. Around the periphery of the coin appear the inscriptions "ROYAL VISIT" above the effigies and "ONE DOLLAR" below the effigies.
- (2) Except as aforesaid, all the provisions of the principal regulations relating to the one-dollar coin shall apply to the coin referred to in subclause (1) of this regulation.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations amend the Coinage Regulations 1967 and prescribe the design for a dollar coin to be issued in 1983 to be known as the 1983 Royal Visit Commemorative Dollar. The design is illustrated below, being actual size reproductions of the coin, with the Machin design used for the effigy of Her Majesty.
