Pursuant to the Medical and Dental Auxiliaries Act 1966, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Chiropodists Regulations 1967, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Chiropodists Regulations 1967* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.
- 2. New qualification for registration—Regulation 4 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding to paragraph (f) of subclause (1) (as amended by regulation 2 of the Chiropodists Regulations 1967, Amendment No. 1) the word "or", and by adding to that subclause the following paragraph:
 - "(g) That he has undergone elsewhere than in New Zealand a course of training in chiropody approved by the Board for the purposes of this paragraph, and has passed an examination in the theory and practice of chiropody that is either oral or written, or partly oral and partly written, conducted by or on behalf of the Board."

- 3. Fees—Regulation 8 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding the following subclause:
- "(8) The fee payable for an examination under paragraph (g) of subclause (1) of regulation 4 of these regulations by an applicant for registration shall be \$25."

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations provide that a person who has undergone an approved course of training overseas, and has passed an examination set by the Chiropodists Board, may be registered as a chiropodist.

They also prescribe an examination fee of \$25.
