THE QUEEN'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 34 of the Decimal Currency Act 1964 and to the Royal Powers Act 1953, Her Majesty the Queen, acting by and with the advice and consent of Her Executive Council, is pleased to make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title—These regulations may be cited as the Coinage Regulations 1967, Amendment No. 6, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Coinage Regulations 1967* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. Silver Jubilee Commemorative Dollar—(1) Notwithstanding regulation 2 (a) of the principal regulations, the design for the one-dollar coin to be known as the Silver Jubilee Commemorative Dollar, to be made and issued pursuant to section 10 (1) of the Decimal Currency Act 1964, shall be as follows:

- (a) For the obverse impression the effigy of Her Majesty the Queen in profile wearing a diamond tiara of festoons, scrolls, and collett-spikes, with the inscriptions "ELIZABETH II QUEEN OF NEW ZEALAND" and "SILVER 1977 JUBILEE" around the periphery of the coin. The Royal cipher "EIIR" shall appear to the left of the effigy, and the words "ACCESSION 6 Feb. 1952" to the right of the effigy:
- (b) For the reverse impression the Treaty House at Waitangi with a pohutukawa tree to the left and part of a taiaha to the right. The words "WAITANGI DAY" and "ONE DOLLAR" shall appear around the periphery of the coin, and the date "6TH. FEBRUARY" shall appear above the Treaty House, and the words "TREATY HOUSE WAITANGI" shall appear below the Treaty House.

(2) Except as aforesaid, all the provisions of the principal regulations relating to the one-dollar coin shall apply to the coin referred to in subclause (1) of this regulation.
