



## THE COINAGE REGULATIONS 1967, AMENDMENT NO. 8

### ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 17th day of September 1979

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 34 of the Decimal Currency Act 1964, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

### REGULATIONS

**1. Title**—These regulations may be cited as the Coinage Regulations 1967, Amendment No. 8, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Coinage Regulations 1967\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

**2. 1979 Dollar Coin**—(1) Notwithstanding anything in regulation 2 (a) of the principal regulations, the design for the one-dollar coin to be known as the 1979 Dollar, to be made and issued pursuant to section 10 (1) of the Decimal Currency Act 1964, shall be as follows:

- (a) For the obverse impression the effigy of Her Majesty the Queen in profile wearing a diamond tiara, earrings, and a necklace, with the inscription “ELIZABETH II QUEEN OF NEW ZEALAND” inside a border pattern around the periphery of the coin and the date “1979” separated from the inscription by two florets:

- (b) For the reverse impression the Ensigns armorial of New Zealand on their shield surmounted by the Royal Crown surrounded by 2 fern fronds and with the words "ONE DOLLAR" underneath the shield. There shall be a wave pattern around the periphery of the coin.
- (2) Except as aforesaid, all the provisions of the principal regulations relating to the one-dollar coin shall apply to the coin referred to in subclause (1) of this regulation.
