ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 29th day of July 1980

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 34 of the Decimal Currency Act 1964, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title—These regulations may be cited as the Coinage Regulations 1967, Amendment No. 9, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Coinage Regulations 1967* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. 1980 Fantail Dollar—(1) Notwithstanding anything in regulation 2 (a) of the principal regulations, the design for the one-dollar coin to be known as the 1980 Fantail Dollar, to be made and issued pursuant to section 10 (1) of the Decimal Currency Act 1964, shall be as follows:

- (a) For the obverse impression the effigy of Her Majesty the Queen in profile wearing a diamond tiara, earrings, and a necklace, with the inscription “ELIZABETH · II QUEEN OF NEW ZEALAND” inside a border pattern around the periphery of the coin and the date “1980” separated from the inscription by 2 florets:
- (b) For the reverse impression a fantail or piwakawaka (*Rhipidura fuliginosa*) perched on a branch of red kowhai or “kaka beak” (*Clianthus puniceus*) in flower and with the words “ONE DOLLAR” underneath the branch.

(2) Except as aforesaid, all the provisions of the principal regulations relating to the one-dollar coin shall apply to the coin referred to in subclause (1) of this regulation.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations prescribe the design for a dollar coin to be issued in 1980 and to be known as the "1980 Fantail Dollar". The obverse impression of the effigy of Her Majesty the Queen was first used in the 1979 Dollar (see S.R. 1979/193). The reverse impression is new, and features a fantail perched on a red kowhai branch.
