### ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 19th day of March 1984

PURSUANT to the Commerce Act 1975, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

## REGULATIONS

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Commerce Regulations 1984.
  - (2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1984.
- 2. Notice with respect to merger and takeover proposals—The Commission may from time to time prescribe the form of notice required to be given under section 70 of the Commerce Act 1975.
- 3. Revocations—The Commerce Regulations 1975\* and the Commerce Regulations 1975, Amendment No. 1† are hereby revoked.

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations which come into force on 1 April 1984, authorise the Commerce Commission to prescribe the form of notice to be given of merger or takeover proposals under section 70 of the Commerce Act 1975 as substituted by the Commerce Amendment Act 1983. The Commerce Amendment Act 1983 comes into force on 1 April 1984.
