



**THE CAMPING-GROUNDS REGULATIONS 1985,
AMENDMENT NO. 1**

HER EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 120B of the Health Act 1956, Her Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Camping-Grounds Regulations 1985, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Camping-Grounds Regulations 1985* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 28th day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. General standards—Regulation 9 (1) (b) of the principal regulations is hereby revoked.

3. Standard of compliance—Regulation 13 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the words “the minimum standards prescribed in the Housing Improvement Regulations 1947”, and

substituting the words “the requirements of the Building Regulations 1992”.

4. Schedule amended—(1) Clause 1 of the Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the words “constructed in accordance with local authority bylaws, and shall be”.

(2) Clause 7 of the Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the words “Drainage and Plumbing Regulations 1978”, and substituting the words “building code set out in the First Schedule to the Building Regulations 1992”.
