



**THE CABINET RULES FOR THE CONDUCT OF CROWN  
LEGAL BUSINESS 1958, AMENDMENT NO. 1**

---

ON the 25th day of June 1962 Cabinet amended the Cabinet Rules for the Conduct of Crown Legal Business 1958\* as follows:

1. By inserting, after rule 7, the following rule:

“7A. All contracts relating to the establishment or extension of any type of industry or commerce in New Zealand, being contracts which provide for Government assistance of a kind or to an extent not then available to others who are or may be interested, whether by grant of a total or partial monopoly, financial aid, tariff or import control protection, or other right or privilege, are to be referred in draft form by a Minister or Permanent Head to the Solicitor-General before being brought before a Minister for signature.”

2. By omitting rule 9, and substituting the following rule:

“9. No solicitor who is an officer of the Public Service shall act in any proceedings in any Court or before any Tribunal on behalf of the Crown or any Government Department or officer of the Crown, unless under a general or special authority of the Solicitor-General.”
