ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 14th day of October 1974

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Marketing Act 1936, and the Agriculture (Emergency Powers) Act 1934, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. **Title and commencement**—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Canterbury Raspberry Marketing Regulations 1950, Amendment No. 4, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Canterbury Raspberry Marketing Regulations 1950\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. **Rate of levy**—Regulation 20 of the principal regulations (as substituted by regulation 2 of the Canterbury Raspberry Marketing Regulations 1950, Amendment No. 3, and amended by section 7 of the Decimal Currency Act 1964), is hereby further amended by omitting from subclause (4) the expression "\$1.25", and substituting the expression "\$3".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations increase the maximum rate of levy that may be fixed by the Minister on land used for growing raspberry plants, from \$1.25 per half acre to \$3.00 per half acre.
