



## THE CREAM RATIONING ORDER 1946

PURSUANT to the Rationing Emergency Regulations 1942\* (hereinafter referred to as the regulations), the Minister of Supply and Munitions hereby makes the following Order.

### ORDER

1. This Order may be cited as the Cream Rationing Order 1946.
2. This Order shall come into force on the 15th day of April, 1946.
3. The following goods shall be rationed goods for the purposes of the regulations—namely, cream.
4. The retailers of the rationed goods hereinbefore referred to shall be licensed under the regulations.
5. (1) The consumers of the rationed goods hereinbefore referred to shall be registered under the regulations.  
(2) No trader shall register any person as a consumer of the rationed goods hereinbefore referred to except as the holder of a permit to consume those goods.  
(3) No trader shall supply any of the rationed goods hereinbefore referred to to any consumer except under the authority of a permit in respect of which the consumer is for the time being duly registered with the trader under the regulations in respect of the business in the course of which the goods are supplied.  
(4) Every retailer who supplies any of the rationed goods hereinbefore referred to to any consumers shall at all times keep in the premises or on the vehicle from which the goods are supplied a register of those consumers showing the quantity of those goods authorized to be supplied to each consumer.
6. Subject to any directions of the Rationing Controller under the regulations, any producer of milk or cream may supply cream to a supplying dairy or to a manufacturing dairy or to a licensed retailer of cream without any further permit or authority than this clause.
