**THE CUSTOMS SURTAX (TOYS AND OTHER GOODS)
EXEMPTION ORDER 1957**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 15th day of May 1957

Present:

THE RIGHT HON. S. G. HOLLAND PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 5 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1930 and to section 6 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1932, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

O R D E R

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Customs Surtax (Toys and Other Goods) Exemption Order 1957.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 17th day of May 1957.

2. The classes of goods set out in the First Schedule hereto are hereby exempted from the surtax imposed by section 5 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1930.

3. (1) The classes of goods set out in the Second Schedule hereto (being the produce or manufacture of any part of the British dominions not already exempted by subsection (1) of section 6 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1932) are hereby exempted from the surtax imposed by section 5 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1930.

(2) The Customs Surtax Order 1948* is hereby amended by omitting from the Schedule so much thereof as relates to Tariff items 239 and 379.

SCHEDULES

FIRST SCHEDULE

GOODS EXEMPTED FROM SURTAX

Tariff Item No.	Classes of Goods
235	<i>Cards, playing.</i>
378	(1) <i>Motor cycles</i> ; bicycles and tricycles, <i>power-operated</i> ; <i>side cars therefor.</i> (2) Bicycles and tricycles, n.e.i. (3) Vehicles n.e.i., <i>designed to be propelled by the occupant</i> by hand or foot power only.
379	(1) Wheels, <i>wire-spoked</i> , not exceeding 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ in. in <i>rim width</i> , viz.: (a) Exceeding 9 in. in <i>rim diameter.</i> (b) Not exceeding 9 in. in <i>rim diameter.</i> (2) Fittings and parts, n.e.i., <i>especially suited</i> for bicycles, tricycles, pedal cars, and <i>similar vehicles</i> , viz.: spokes, in the rough or finished; and the following articles when not plated, japanned, enamelled, or varnished, viz.: drop forgings, stampings, wood or metal rims (not bored), forks, stays, handle bars, and seat pillars, <i>unbuilt</i> , bracket shells, fork ends and stay ends, fork tips, bridges, crowns, and lugs.

SECOND SCHEDULE

GOODS EXEMPTED WHEN PRODUCED OR MANUFACTURED IN THE BRITISH DOMINIONS

Tariff Item No.	Classes of Goods
239	(1) Toys, being articles <i>designed as playthings for children.</i> NOTE—Goods of the class or kind described in this item shall, unless the Minister directs otherwise, be classed under this item notwithstanding that such goods may be specifically enumerated elsewhere in the Tariff. (2) Bicycles, tricycles, pedal cars, and <i>similar vehicles, designed for children's use.</i> (3) Tennis, badminton, and squash racquets; golf clubs; golf bags; footballs and basketballs. (4) <i>Sporting</i> , and <i>athletic requisites</i> , n.e.i., including <i>billiard requisites</i> n.e.i.; fishing tackle n.e.i., including artificial flies and other baited hooks. (5) <i>Games</i> ; <i>gaming requisites</i> n.e.i.; <i>fancy goods</i> ; walking sticks; combs, hair and toilet.
