EXEMPTION ORDER 1957**

**ORDER IN COUNCIL**

At the Government House at Wellington this 25th day of September 1957

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 5 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1930 and to section 6 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1932, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

---

**ORDER**

**1.** (1) This order may be cited as the Customs Surtax (Paints and Related Products) Exemption Order 1957.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 27th day of September 1957.

**2.** (1) The classes of goods set out in the First Schedule hereto are hereby exempted from the surtax imposed by section 5 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1930.

(2) The class of goods set out in the Second Schedule hereto (being the produce or manufacture of any part of the British dominions not already exempted by subsection (1) of section 6 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1932) are hereby exempted from the surtax imposed by section 5 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1930.

**3.** (1) The Customs Surtax Order 1938\* is hereby amended by omitting from the Schedule so much thereof as relates to Tariff item 397 (2), (3), (4).

(2) The Customs Surtax Order 1948† is hereby amended by omitting from the Schedule so much thereof as relates to Tariff items 395 ex (3), 397 ex (2), ex (3).
