THE CUSTOMS SURTAX (STATIONERY) EXEMPTION
ORDER 1956

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 12th day of December 1956

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 6 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1932, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Customs Surtax (Stationery) Exemption Order 1956.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 14th day of December 1956.

2. (1) The classes of goods set out in the First Schedule hereto (being the produce or manufacture of any part of the British dominions not already exempted by subsection (1) of the said section 6) are hereby exempted from the surtax imposed by section 5 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1930.

(2) The Customs Surtax Order 1948,* exempting certain goods from surtax, is hereby amended by omitting from the Schedule so much thereof as relates to Tariff item No. 297.

3. (1) The classes of goods set out in the Second Schedule hereto (being the produce or manufacture of the Dominion of Canada) are hereby exempted from the surtax imposed by section 5 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1930.

(2) The Customs Surtax Order 1938†, exempting from surtax certain goods the produce or manufacture of Canada, is hereby amended by omitting from the Schedule so much thereof as relates to Tariff items Nos. 297, 304, and 305.
