## THE CUSTOMS SURTAX EXEMPTION ORDER (NO. 2) 1955

### ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 1st day of June 1955

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 5 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1930, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

### ORDER

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Customs Surtax Exemption Order (No. 2) 1955.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 3rd day of June 1955.

2. The classes of goods set out in the Schedule hereto are hereby exempted from the surtax imposed by section 5 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1930.
