THE CUSTOMS SURTAX EXEMPTION ORDER (NO. 4) 1955

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 14th day of September 1955

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 5 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1930, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Customs Surtax Exemption Order (No. 4) 1955.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 16th day of September 1955.

2. The classes of goods set out in the Schedule hereto are hereby exempted from the surtax imposed by section 5 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1930.

SCHEDULE

GOODS EXEMPTED FROM SURTAX

261	(1) Tobacco pipes; tobacco pipe cases; cigar and cigarette holders.
322	(2) Tobacco pouches and cases; cigar and cigarette cases. Cartridges, cartridge cases, and materials for the manufacture thereof, viz.: (1) Cartridges— (c) (i) Ball, .22 calibre, <i>rimfire</i> . (2) Cartridge cases— (b) .22 calibre, <i>primed</i> .
353	Machinery, machines, engines, and other appliances, n.e.i., viz.: (10) Mufflers suited for use on internal combustion engines. (11) Pistons, cylinder sleeves, and piston rings, viz.: (a) For use in cylinders having a bore not exceeding 4 in. (b) For use in cylinders having a bore exceeding 4 in.
