THE CUSTOMS SURTAX EXEMPTION ORDER (NO. 6) 1955

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 21st day of December 1955

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 6 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1932, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Customs Surtax Exemption Order (No. 6) 1955.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 22nd day of December 1955.

2. The classes of goods set out in the Schedule hereto (being the produce or manufacture of any part of the British dominions not already exempted by subsection (1) of the said section 6) are hereby exempted from the surtax imposed by section 5 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1930.

SCHEDULE

GOODS EXEMPTED FROM SURTAX WHEN PRODUCED OR MANUFACTURED IN THE BRITISH DOMINIONS

Tariff Item No.	Class of Goods
353	Machinery, machines, engines, and <i>other appliances</i> , n.e.i., viz.: (12) (a) Ironing machines or presses, electrically heated, having rollers or heated top plates not exceeding 30 inches in length. (b) Clothes pressing machines, <i>manually operated</i> , steam heated, fitted with perforated pressing heads.
