THE CUSTOMS SURTAX ORDER 1950

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington, this 31st day of May, 1950

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 6 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act, 1932, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby order as follows :---

1. This Order may be cited as the Customs Surtax Order 1950.

2. This Order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 27th day of May, 1950.

3. The classes of goods set out in the Schedule hereto (being the produce or manufacture of any part of the British dominions not already exempted by subsection (1) of the said section 6) are hereby exempted from the surtax imposed by section 5 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act, 1930.

4. The exemptions provided for by this Order are in addition to and not in derogation of the exemptions provided for by the Customs Surtax Order 1938* and the Customs Surtax Order 1948.†
