**THE CUSTOMS SURTAX (OXIDES OF ZINC AND WHITE
LEAD) EXEMPTION ORDER 1958**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 9th day of July 1958

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 5 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1930, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Customs Surtax (Oxides of Zinc and White Lead) Exemption Order 1958.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 11th day of July 1958.

2. The classes of goods set out in the Schedule hereto are hereby exempted from the surtax imposed by section 5 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1930.

3. The Customs Surtax (Paints and Related Products) Exemption Order 1957* is hereby amended by omitting from the First Schedule so much thereof as relates to Tariff item 397 (1) (e), (f).

SCHEDULE

GOODS EXEMPTED FROM SURTAX

Tariff Item No.	Classes of Goods
397	Paints, colours, varnishes, and related produces, viz.: (1) Paints and colours, dry, viz.: (d) Oxides of zinc in admixture with other substances, as the Minister may determine. (e) White lead in admixture with other substances, as the Minister may determine. (f) Kalsomine, distempers, and <i>similar</i> preparations. (g) <i>Cement-based paints</i> .
