WHEREAS by the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 5) 1973*, made pursuant to section 10E of the Tariff and Development Board Act 1961 and section 124 of the Customs Act 1966, the duties and exemption from duty specified in the Schedule to that order were temporarily imposed and created on the recommendation of the Tariff and Development Board: And whereas pursuant to the said section 10E the Tariff and Development Board has since recommended that the temporary duties and exemption so imposed and created should be reimposed and re-created:

Now therefore, pursuant to section 10E of the Tariff and Development Board Act 1961 and section 124 of the Customs Act 1966, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and being satisfied that the rates of duty and exemption from duty specified in the Schedule hereto, are necessary for the protection of an industry carried on in New Zealand, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Customs Tariff (Carboxylic Acids) Amendment Order 1974.

(2) This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Duties and exemption reimposed—(1) Notwithstanding the revocation by this order of the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 5) 1973*, the portion of the Customs Tariff specified in the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 5) 1972[†] shall continue to be suspended.

(2) The duties and exemption from duty set out in the Schedule to this order (being the same duties and exemption as were set out in the Schedule to the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 5) 1973*) are hereby imposed and created and shall continue in force accordingly.

3. Consequential revocations—The Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 5) 1973* is hereby consequentially revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its genera leffect.

The effect of this order is to reimpose temporary increases in the rates of Customs duty on 2-methyl-4-chlorophenoxybutyric acid and salts and esters thereof (MCPB), and 2,4-dichlorophenoxybutyric acid and salts and esters thereof (2.4-DB).

The temporary increases were originally imposed by the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 5) 1972, and were subsequently reimposed by Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 5) 1973.

Issued under the authority of the Regulations Act 1936. Date of notification in *Gazette:* 21 February 1974. This order is administered in the Customs Department.
