THE CUSTOMS TARIFF AMENDMENT ORDER (NO. 14) 1970

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 31st day of August 1970

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

WHEREAS by the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 10) 1969*, made pursuant to section 10E of the Tariff and Development Board Act 1961 and section 124 of the Customs Act 1966, the portions of the Customs Tariff specified in the First Schedule to that order were suspended and the duties and exemptions from duty specified in the Second Schedule to that order were temporarily imposed and created on the recommendation of the Emergency Protection Authority: And whereas pursuant to the said section 10E the Emergency Protection Authority has since recommended that the temporary duties and exemptions so imposed and created (as modified by the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 17) 1969†) should be reimposed and re-created:

Now therefore, pursuant to section 10E of the Tariff and Development Board Act 1961 and section 124 of the Customs Act 1966, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and being satisfied that the rates of duty and exemptions from duty specified in the First Schedule to the first-mentioned order would, if restored, be likely to operate in an injurious, unfair, or anomalous manner in respect of an industry carried on in New Zealand, and that it is necessary for the protection of that industry that the duties set out in the Schedule hereto should be reimposed, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 14) 1970.

(2) This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Duties and exemptions reimposed—(1) Notwithstanding the revocation by this order of the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 10) 1969*, the portions of the Customs Tariff specified in the First Schedule to that order shall continued to be suspended.

(2) The duties and exemptions from duty set out in the Schedule to this order (being the same duties and exemptions as were set out in the Second Schedule to the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 10) 1969* as modified by the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 17) 1969†) are hereby imposed and created and shall continue in force accordingly.

3. Revocations—(1) The Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 10) 1969* is hereby consequentially revoked.

(2) The Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 17) 1969† is hereby consequentially amended by revoking so much of the Second Schedule as relates to item 85.23.23.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

The effect of this order is to reimpose temporary increases in Customs duty on certain insulated wire and cable.

The temporary increases were imposed by the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 10) 1969. That order (as modified by the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 17) 1969) is replaced by this order.
