ORDER IN COUNCIL

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

WHEREAS by the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 9) 1968\*, made pursuant to section 10E of the Tariff and Development Board Act 1961 and section 124 of the Customs Act 1966, the portions of the Customs Tariff specified in the First Schedule to that order were suspended and the duties and exemption from duty specified in the Second Schedule to that order were temporarily imposed and created on the recommendation of the Emergency Protection Authority: And whereas that order was replaced by the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 11) 1969†, and the said temporary duties and exemption from duty are now included in the Second Schedule to the last-mentioned order as items 82.02.13 and 82.02.19: And whereas pursuant to the said section 10E the Emergency Protection Authority has since recommended that the said temporary duties and exemption from duty should be reimposed and re-created:

Now therefore, pursuant to section 10E of the Tariff and Development Board Act 1961 and section 124 of the Customs Act 1966, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and being satisfied that the rates of duty and exemption from duty specified in the First Schedule to the first-mentioned order would, if restored, be likely to operate in an injurious, unfair, or anomalous manner in respect of an industry carried on in New Zealand, and that it is necessary for the protection of that industry that the duties set out in the Schedule hereto should be reimposed, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) This order may be cited as the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 16) 1969.

(2) This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

**2. Duties and exemption reimposed**—(1) The duties and exemption from duty set out in the Schedule to this order (being the same duties and exemption as were imposed and created by the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 9) 1968 and later included in the Second Schedule to the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 11) 1969) are hereby imposed and created and shall continue in force accordingly.

**3. Revocation**—The Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 11) 1969 is hereby consequentially amended by revoking so much of the Second Schedule as relates to items 82.02.13 and 82.02.19.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.*

The effect of this order is to reimpose temporary increases in Customs duty on bandsaw blades and toothed bandsaw strip, exceeding 4 inches in width, for wood sawing.

The temporary increases were originally imposed by the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 9) 1968.

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Issued under the authority of the Regulations Act 1936.

Date of notification in *Gazette*: 13 November 1969.
