THE CUSTOMS TARIFF AMENDMENT ORDER (NO. 16) 1970

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 14th day of September 1970

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

WHEREAS by the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 7) 1969*, made pursuant to section 10E of the Tariff and Development Board Act 1961 and section 124 of the Customs Act 1966, the portions of the Customs Tariff specified in the First Schedule to that order were suspended and the duties specified in the Second Schedule to that order were temporarily imposed on the recommendation of the Emergency Protection Authority: And whereas the Tariff and Development Board has since recommended that the temporary duties so imposed should be revoked and that the duties and exemptions from duty set out in the Second Schedule to this order should be imposed and created:

Now, therefore, pursuant to section 124 of the Customs Act 1966, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and being satisfied that the rates of duty and exemptions from duty specified in the First Schedule hereto, being rates and exemptions specified in the Customs Tariff (as set out in the Second Schedule to the Customs Act 1966 and heretofore modified) are likely to operate in an injurious, unfair, or anomalous manner either generally to the public interest or particularly to a certain industry carried on in New Zealand, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 16) 1970.

(2) This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Portions of Tariff suspended—The portions of the Customs Tariff specified in the First Schedule hereto are hereby suspended.

3. Duties imposed and exemptions created—The duties set out in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby imposed, and the exemptions from duty in that Schedule are hereby created.

4. Revocation—The Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 7) 1969* is hereby consequentially revoked.

It also imposes increased duties on terpineol.
