#### THE CUSTOMS TARIFF AMENDMENT ORDER 1951

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 17th day of April, 1951

#### Present:

THE RIGHT HON. S. G. HOLLAND PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to section 12 of the Customs Amendment Act, 1921, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and being satisfied that the existing duties are likely to operate in an injurious manner generally to the public interest, doth hereby order as follows:—

- 1. (1) This order may be cited as the Customs Tariff Amendment Order 1951.
- (2) This order shall come into force on the 20th day of April 1951.
- 2. The existing Tariff (being the First Schedule to the Customs Acts Amendment Act, 1934, as amended by the Customs Tariff Amendment Order 1938, No. 2\*) is hereby suspended in so far as it relates to the goods set out in the First Schedule hereto.
- 3. The exemptions from duty set forth in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby created and the duties set out therein are hereby imposed.
- **4.** Every exemption from duty or application of duties hereby effected shall be subject to the provisions of section 143 of the Customs Act, 1913.
- 5. All duties of Customs that have become due and payable and all penalties and forfeitures that have been incurred before the coming into force of this order shall be recovered and enforced as if this order had not been made.
- 6. Nothing in this order shall be deemed to affect the provisions of section 5 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act, 1930, in respect of the imposition on any goods affected by this order of surtax upon the duties hereby imposed.

### EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.]

This order exempts prefabricated houses of metal or wood from Customs duty until the end of 1952, when the present duties will again become payable.

Issued under the authority of the Regulations Act, 1936. Date of notification in *Gazette*: 19th day of April, 1951. These regulations are administered in the Customs Department.
