ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 18th day of March 1963

Present:

THE RIGHT HON. KEITH HOLYOAKE, C.H., PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to sections 12 and 31 (5) of the Customs Amendment Act 1921 and section 6 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1961, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and being satisfied that the rates of duty set out in the First Schedule hereto, being rates of duty specified in the Customs Tariff (as set out in the First Schedule to the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1961 and heretofore amended), are likely to operate in an injurious, unfair, or anomalous manner either generally to the public interest or particularly to certain industries, trades, or businesses established or carried on in New Zealand, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Customs Tariff Amendment Order 1963.

(2) This order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 20th day of September 1962.

2. (1) Group 641 of Part I of the Customs Tariff (as substituted by clause 2 (1) of the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 5) 1962*) is hereby amended by suspending the Tariff items and the rates of duty and exemptions from duty specified in the First Schedule hereto, and substituting the Tariff items and the rates of duty and exemptions from duty specified in the Second Schedule hereto.

(2) The duties set out in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby imposed, and the exemptions from duty in that Schedule are hereby created.

3. This order shall be in force in the Cook Islands.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

The effect of clause 2 of this order is to reduce the rates of duty on embossed printing and writing paper by bringing the rates into line with those applicable to other printing and writing papers under the Customs Tariff.

Clause 3 applies this order to the Cook Islands.
