ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 26th day of January 1970

WHEREAS by the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 16) 1969*, made pursuant to section 10E of the Tariff and Development Board Act 1961 and section 124 of the Customs Act 1966, the Customs duties specified in the Schedule to that order were temporarily reimposed on the recommendation of the Emergency Protection Authority: And whereas the Tariff and Development Board has since recommended that the temporary duties so imposed should be revoked and that additional duties should be imposed:

Now therefore, pursuant to section 124 of the Customs Act 1966, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and being satisfied that the rates of duty and exemption from duty specified in the First Schedule hereto, being rates and an exemption specified in the Customs Tariff (as set out in the Second Schedule to the Customs Act 1966 and heretofore modified) are likely to operate in an injurious, unfair, or anomalous manner generally to the public interest and particularly to certain industries carried on in New Zealand, and that it is necessary for the protection of those industries that the duties set out in the Second Schedule hereto should be imposed, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Customs Tariff Amendment Order 1970.

(2) This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Portion of Tariff suspended—The portion of the Customs Tariff specified in the First Schedule hereto is hereby suspended.

3. Duties imposed and exemption created—The duties set out in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby imposed, and the exemption from duty in that Schedule is hereby created.

4. Revocation—The Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 16) 1969* is hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order suspends the temporary additional rates of Customs duty imposed by the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 16) 1969 on bandsaw blades and toothed bandsaw strip, over 4 in. in width, for wood sawing, and imposes increased rates recommended by the Tariff and Development Board.
