THE CUSTOMS TARIFF AMENDMENT ORDER (NO. 2) 1951

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington, this 4th day of
July, 1951

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 12 of the Customs Amendment Act, 1921, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and being satisfied that the existing duties are likely to operate in an injurious manner generally to the public interest, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 2) 1951.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 6th day of July, 1951.

2. The existing Tariff (being the First Schedule to the Customs Acts Amendment Act, 1934) is hereby suspended in so far as it relates to the goods set out in the First Schedule hereto.

3. The exemption from duty set forth in the Second Schedule hereto is hereby created and the duties set out therein are hereby imposed.

4. Every exemption from duty or application of duties hereby affected shall be subject to the provisions of section 143 of the Customs Act, 1913.

5. All duties of Customs that have become due and payable and all penalties and forfeitures that have been incurred before the commencement of this order shall be recovered and enforced as if this order had not been made.

6. Nothing in this order shall be deemed to affect the provisions of section 5 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act, 1930, in respect of the imposition on any goods affected by this order of surtax upon the duties hereby imposed.
