**THE CUSTOMS TARIFF AMENDMENT ORDER (NO. 2) 1956**

**ORDER IN COUNCIL**

At the Government House at Wellington this 29th day of February 1956

**Present:**

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 12 of the Customs Amendment Act 1921, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and being satisfied that the existing duties are likely to operate in an injurious manner generally to the public interest, hereby makes the following order.

**ORDER**

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 2) 1956.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 2nd day of March 1956.

2. The existing Tariff (being the First Schedule to the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1934, as amended by the Customs Tariff Amendment Order 1954\*) is hereby suspended in so far as it relates to the goods set out in the First Schedule hereto.

3. The duties set out in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby imposed.

4. Every application of duty hereby effected shall be subject to the provisions of section 143 of the Customs Act 1913.

5. All duties of Customs that have become due and payable and all penalties and forfeitures that have been incurred before the commencement of this order shall be recovered and enforced as if this order had not been made.

6. Nothing in this order shall be deemed to affect the provisions of section 5 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1930 in respect of the imposition on any goods affected by this order of surtax upon the duties hereby imposed.

7. The Customs Tariff Amendment Order 1954\* is hereby revoked.

This order provides for certain increases in the rates of duty on jams, jellies, marmalade, and preserves, n.e.i., following a public Tariff inquiry conducted by the Board of Trade.
