Pursuant to section 125 of the Customs Act 1966, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

- 1. (1) This order may be cited as the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 2) 1969.
- (2) This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the Gazette.
- 2. Part II of the Customs Tariff is hereby amended by revoking reference numbers 10.1 and 10.2, and the descriptions and rates of duty to which those numbers relate, and substituting the reference numbers, descriptions, and rates of duty specified in the Schedule hereto.

This order enables variations to be made to the Most Favoured Nation and General Tariff rates of duty which apply to goods approved for concessionary entry under reference numbers 10.1 and 10.2 of Part II of the Customs Tariff.
