THE CUSTOMS TARIFF AMENDMENT ORDER (NO. 2) 1972

WHEREAS by the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 8) 1971*, made pursuant to section 10E of the Tariff and Development Board Act 1961 and section 124 of the Customs Act 1966, the duties and exemptions from duty specified in the Schedule to that order were temporarily imposed and created on the recommendation of the Emergency Protection Authority: And whereas the Tariff and Development Board has since recommended that the temporary duties so imposed should be revoked:

Now therefore, pursuant to section 125 of the Customs Act 1966, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and being satisfied that the revocation of the temporary duties specified in the Schedule to the said order is necessary in furtherance of the public interest, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 2) 1972.

(2) This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Tariff amended—The Customs Tariff (as set out in the First Schedule to the Customs Amendment Act 1971) is hereby amended by revoking the item, rates of duty, and exemptions from duty specified in the First Schedule hereto, and substituting the item, rates of duty, and exemptions from duty specified in the Second Schedule hereto.

3. Revocation—The Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 8) 1971* is hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order revokes the temporary increases in the rates of Customs duty on certain paints and enamels of a kind used on recreational models.

The temporary increases were originally imposed by the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 12) 1970, and were subsequently reimposed by Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 8) 1971.
