WHEREAS by the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 8) 1973* and the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 19) 1973†, made pursuant to section 10E of the Tariff and Development Board Act 1961 and section 124 of the Customs Act 1966, the portions of the Customs Tariff specified in the Schedules to those orders were temporarily reimposed and re-created on the recommendation of the Tariff and Development Board: And whereas the said temporary duties and exemptions from duty are now included in the Customs Tariff by the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1974: And whereas pursuant to the said section 10E the Tariff and Development Board has since recommended that the said temporary duties and exemptions from duty should be reimposed and re-created:

Now therefore, pursuant to section 10E of the Tariff and Development Board Act 1961 and section 124 of the Customs Act 1966, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and being satisfied that the rates of duty and exemptions from duty specified in the Schedule hereto, being rates and exemptions specified in the Customs Tariff, are necessary for the protection of industries carried on in New Zealand, and that the duties set out in the Schedule hereto should be reimposed, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Customs Tariff (Composite) Amendment Order (No. 2) 1974.

(2) This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Duties and exemptions reimposed—The duties and exemptions from duty set out in the Schedule to this order (being the same duties and exemptions as were set out in the Schedule to the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 8) 1973* and the Schedule to the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 19) 1973†, as modified by the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1974), are hereby imposed and created and shall continue in force accordingly.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

The effect of this order is to reimpose temporary increases in the rates of Customs duty on certain prepared or preserved fish falling within heading 16.04, and certain wines falling within headings 22.05 and 22.06 of the Customs Tariff.

The temporary increases were originally imposed by the Customs Tariff Amendment Orders (No. 17) 1972 (No. 19) 1972 and (No. 2) 1973.
