THE CUSTOMS TARIFF AMENDMENT ORDER (NO. 3) 1955

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 7th day of September 1955

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 12 of the Customs Amendment Act 1921, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and being satisfied that the existing duties are likely to operate in an injurious manner generally to the public interest, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 3) 1955.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 9th day of September 1955.

2. The existing Tariff (being the First Schedule to the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1934, as modified by the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 2) 1955*) is hereby suspended in so far as it relates to the goods set out in the First Schedule hereto.

3. The duties set out in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby imposed.

4. The Second Schedule to the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade Act 1948, (as modified by the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 2) 1955*) is hereby further modified by the deletion therefrom of the duty set out in the Third Schedule hereto and by the substitution therefor of the duty set out in the Fourth Schedule hereto.

5. Every application of duty hereby effected shall be subject to the provisions of section 143 of the Customs Act 1913.

6. All duties of Customs that have become due and payable and all penalties and forfeitures that have been incurred before the commencement of this order shall be recoverable and enforced as if this order had not been made.

7. Nothing in this order shall be deemed to affect the provisions of section 5 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1930 in respect of the imposition on any goods affected by this order of surtax upon the duties hereby imposed.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This order reimposes the duty under the British Preferential tariff on printed self-adhesive plastic tape and increases the rates applied to imports from foreign sources.
