ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 15th day of March 1971

PURSUANT to section 124 of the Customs Act 1966, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and being satisfied that the rates of duty specified in the First Schedule hereto, being rates specified in the Customs Tariff (as set out in the Second Schedule to the Customs Act 1966 and heretofore modified) are likely to operate in an injurious, unfair, or anomalous manner generally to the public interest and particularly to certain industries carried on in New Zealand, and that it is necessary for the protection of those industries that the duties set out in the Second Schedule hereto should be imposed, hereby makes the following order.


ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 4) 1971.

(2) This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Portion of Tariff suspended—The portion of the Customs Tariff specified in the First Schedule hereto is hereby suspended.


3. Duties imposed and exemption created—The duties set out in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby imposed, and the exemption from duty in that Schedule is hereby created.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order makes provision for increases in the rates of Customs duty (by means of determination by the Minister of Customs) on certain knives and cutting blades, for machines or for mechanical appliances.

machines or for mechanical appliances. The increases imposed by this order result from recommendations made by the Tariff and Development Board.
