## THE CUSTOMS TARIFF AMENDMENT ORDER (NO. 4) 1972

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 13th day of March 1972

#### Present:

THE RIGHT HON. J. R. MARSHALL PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

Whereas by the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 21) 1970\*, made pursuant to section 10e of the Tariff and Development Board Act 1961 and section 124 of the Customs Act 1966, the portions of the Customs Tariff specified in the First Schedule to that order were suspended and the duties and exemptions from duty specified in the Second Schedule to that order were temporarily imposed and created on the recommendation of the Emergency Protection Authority: And whereas the Tariff and Development Board has since recommended that the temporary duties so imposed should be amended:

Now therefore, pursuant to section 124 of the Customs Act 1966, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and being satisfied that the item, rates of duty, and exemption from duty specified in the Second Schedule hereto are necessary for the protection of an industry in New Zealand, hereby makes the following order.

#### ORDER

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 4) 1972.
- (2) This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the Gazette.
- 2. Portion of Tariff suspended—The portion of the Customs Tariff specified in the First Schedule hereto is hereby suspended.
- 3. Duties imposed and exemption created—The duties set out in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby imposed, and the exemption from duty in that Schedule is hereby created.
- **4. Revocation**—The Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 21) 1970\* is hereby revoked.

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

This order reduces the temporary rates of Customs duty on unsintered polytetra-fluoroethylene (P.T.F.E.) tape imposed by the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 21) 1970. The reductions were recommended by the Tariff and Development Board.
