ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 5th day of February 1973

PURSUANT to section 125 of the Customs Act 1966, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 4) 1973.

(2) This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Part II of the Customs Tariff is hereby amended by revoking reference number 23.4, and the description and rates of duty to which that number relates, and substituting the reference number, description, and rates of duty specified in the Schedule hereto.
