HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 12 of the Customs Amendment Act 1921, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and being satisfied that the existing duties are likely to operate in an injurious manner generally to the public interest, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 6) 1951.

(2) This order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 31st day of October 1951.

2. The existing Tariff (being the First Schedule to the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1934) is hereby suspended in so far as it relates to the duty under the British Preferential Tariff on the goods set out in the First Schedule hereto, and the duties set out in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby imposed in lieu thereof.

3. Every application of duties hereby effected shall be subject to the provisions of section 143 of the Customs Act 1913.

4. All duties of Customs that have become due and payable, and all penalties and forfeitures that have been incurred before the commencement of this order, shall be recovered and enforced as if this order had not been made.
