THE CUSTOMS TARIFF AMENDMENT ORDER (NO. 7) 1972

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 6th day of June 1972

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

WHEREAS by the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 5) 1971*, made pursuant to section 10E of the Tariff and Development Board Act 1961 and section 124 of the Customs Act 1966, the portions of the Customs Tariff specified in the First Schedule to that order were suspended and the duties and exemptions specified in the Second Schedule to that order were temporarily imposed and created on the recommendation of the Emergency Protection Authority: And whereas the Tariff and Development Board has since recommended that the said temporary duties and exemptions set out in the said Second Schedule should continue in force: And whereas the said temporary duties and exemptions are now included in the Customs Tariff (as substituted by the First Schedule to the Customs Amendment Act 1971) as items 62.03.011 and 62.03.019: And whereas the Tariff and Development Board has also recommended that the rates of duty specified in the Second Schedule hereto should be amended:

Now therefore, pursuant to section 124 of the Customs Act 1966, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and being satisfied that the exemptions from duty on item 62.03.02 specified in the First Schedule to the said order would, if restored, be likely to operate in an injurious, unfair or anomalous manner in respect of industries carried on in New Zealand, and being satisfied that the rates of duty specified in the Second Schedule hereto are likely to operate in an injurious, unfair or anomalous manner in respect generally to the public interest and that it is necessary in the public interest that the duties set out in the Third Schedule hereto should be imposed, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 7) 1972.

(2) This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Duties and exemptions continued in force—The duties and exemptions from duty set out in the First Schedule to this order (being the same duties and exemptions on items 62.03.11 and 62.03.12 as were set out in the Second Schedule to the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 5) 1971*) are hereby imposed and created and shall continue in force accordingly.

3. Portion of Tariff suspended—The portion of the Customs Tariff specified in the Second Schedule hereto is hereby suspended.

4. Duties imposed—The duties set out in the Third Schedule hereto are hereby imposed.

5. Revocation—The Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 5) 1971* is hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order makes permanent the temporary duties imposed on certain textile sacks and bags, of a kind used for the packing of goods, by the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 5) 1971*. It also reduces the General Tariff rate of duty on certain other textile sacks and bags, of a kind used for the packing of goods.

The provisions contained in this order result from recommendations made by the Tariff and Development Board.
