ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 24th day of September 1973

WHEREAS by the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 19) 1972*, made pursuant to section 10E of the Tariff and Development Board Act 1961 and section 124 of the Customs Act 1966, the portion of the Customs Tariff specified in the First Schedule to that order was suspended and the duties specified in the Second Schedule to that order were temporarily imposed on the recommendation of the Emergency Protection Authority: And whereas pursuant to the said section 10E the Tariff and Development Board has since recommended that the said temporary duties should be reimposed:

Now therefore, pursuant to section 10E of the Tariff and Development Board Act 1961 and section 124 of the Customs Act 1966, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and being satisfied that the rates of duty specified in the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 19) 1972 would, if restored, be likely to operate in an injurious, unfair, or anomalous manner in respect of an industry carried on in New Zealand, and that it is necessary for the protection of that industry that the duties set out in the Schedule hereto should be reimposed, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 8) 1973.

(2) This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Duties reimposed—(1) Notwithstanding the revocation by this order of the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 19) 1972*, the portions of the Customs Tariff specified in the First Schedule to that order shall continue to be suspended.

(2) The duties set out in the Schedule to this order (being the same duties as were set out in the Second Schedule to the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 19) 1972*) are hereby imposed and shall continue in force accordingly.

3. Revocations—The Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 19) 1972* is hereby consequentially revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

The effect of this order is to reimpose temporary increases in the rates of Customs duty on certain wines of Chapter 22 of the Customs Tariff. The temporary increases were originally imposed by the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 19) 1972.
