ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 17th day of June 1968

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 124 of the Customs Act 1966, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and being satisfied that the rates of duty and exemption from duty specified in the First Schedule hereto, being rates and exemptions specified in the Customs Tariff (as set out in the Second Schedule to the Customs Act 1966) are likely to operate in an injurious, unfair, or anomalous manner generally to the public interest and particularly to certain industries or businesses carried on in New Zealand, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 3) 1968.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 1st day of July 1968.

2. The portions of the Customs Tariff specified in the First Schedule hereto are hereby suspended.

3. The duties set out in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby imposed, and the exemptions from duty in that Schedule are hereby created.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order alters the Customs Tariff in respect of certain narrow woven fabrics of cotton, linen, or jute by substituting an approval procedure for the present determination procedure, and by creating a separate sub-item for towelling and terry fabrics.
