### THE CUSTOMS TARIFF AMENDMENT ORDER (NO. 4) 1967

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to section 124 of the Customs Act 1966, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and being satisfied that the rates of duty and exemptions from duty specified in the First Schedule hereto, being rates and exemptions specified in the Customs Tariff (as set out in the Second Schedule to the Customs Act 1966) are likely to operate in an injurious, unfair, or anomalous manner either generally to the public interest or particularly to an industry, trade, or business carried on in New Zealand, hereby makes the following order.

#### ORDER

- 1. (1) This order may be cited as the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 4) 1967.
  - (2) This order shall come into force on the 1st day of July 1967.
- 2. The portion of the Customs Tariff specified in the First Schedule hereto is hereby suspended.
- 3. The duties set out in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby imposed, and the exemptions from duty in that Schedule are hereby created.
  - 4. This order shall be in force in Niue.
- 5. The Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 2) 1967\* is hereby amended by adding the following clause:
  - "6. This order shall be in force in Niue."

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order aligns the Most Favoured Nation and General Tariff rates of duty in the 1967 Tariff on raw cocoa beans with those in the 1962 Tariff by reducing the rates from 83c to 41c. The order applies to Niue; and it also brings the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 2) 1967 into force in Niue.
