## THE CUSTOMS TARIFF AMENDMENT ORDER (NO. 7) 1968

PURSUANT to section 125 of the Customs Act 1966, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

### ORDER

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 7) 1968.

(2) This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Part II of the Customs Tariff, as set out in the Second Schedule to the Customs Act 1966, is hereby amended by revoking subparagraph (ii) of paragraph (a) of Reference No. 27.1.

### EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.*

This order amends the concession relating to the bringing in of passengers' baggage, and removes the requirement that, in order to qualify for concessionary entry under the Tariff, passengers' wearing apparel and other personal effects must have been worn or used before importation.
