## THE CUSTOMS TARIFF (ELECTRIC BATTERIES) ORDER 1956

At the Government House at Wellington this 20th day of June 1956

#### Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 12 of the Customs Amendment Act 1921, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and being satisfied that the existing duties are likely to operate in an injurious manner generally to the public interest, hereby makes the following order.

## ORDER

- 1. (1) This order may be cited as the Customs Tariff (Electric Batteries) Order 1956.
  - (2) This order shall come into force on the 22nd day of June 1956.
- 2. The existing Tariff (being the First Schedule to the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1934 as modified by the Customs Tariff Amendment Order 1938 No. 2,\* and by the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 2) 1954†) is hereby suspended in so far as it relates to the goods set out in the First Schedule hereto.
- 3. The exemptions from duty set out in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby created and the duties set out therein are hereby imposed.
- 4. The Second Schedule to the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade Act 1948 (as modified by the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 2) 1954†) is hereby further modified by the deletion therefrom of the duties set out in the Third Schedule hereto and by the substitution therefor of the duties set out in the Fourth Schedule hereto.
- 5. Every exemption from duty or application of duty hereby effected shall be subject to the provisions of section 143 of the Customs Act 1913.

6. All duties of Customs that have become due and payable and all penalties and forfeitures that have been incurred before the commencement of this order shall be recovered and enforced as if this order had not been made.
