

## THE CITRUS TREES DISEASES REGULATIONS 1957

## Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to the Orchard and Garden Diseases Act 1928, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

## REGULATIONS

- 1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Citrus Trees Diseases Regulations 1957.
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the seventh day after the date of their notification in the Gazette.
- 2. Except with the consent of the Director of the Horticulture Division of the Department of Agriculture, no person shall remove or cause to be removed any citrus plant (other than citrus fruit), or any citrus seed intended for propagation, or any plant capable of being used as a root stock for citrus plants, from any place in New Zealand outside the Provincial District of Auckland into that Provincial District.
