THE CHATTELS TRANSFER FEES REGULATIONS 1975

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 26th day of May 1975

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Chattels Transfer Act 1924, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Chattels Transfer Fees Regulations 1975.

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 2nd day of June 1975.

2. Fees—There shall be paid to the Registrar for the various matters set out in the Schedule hereto the respective fees set out in that Schedule.

3. Revocation—The Chattels Transfer Fees Regulations 1967* are hereby consequentially revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 2 June 1975, prescribe a new and increased scale of fees payable under the Chattels Transfer Act 1924 to Registrars. Search fees have been abolished except where an instrument (other than a transfer) is searched by a person for the purpose of publishing it or particulars of it.
