PURSUANT to section 19A of the Chattels Transfer Act 1924, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Chattels Transfer Fees Regulations 1987.

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1987.

2. Fees—There shall be paid to the Registrar for the various matters set out in the Schedule hereto the respective fees set out in that Schedule.

3. Revocation—The Chattels Transfer Fees Regulations 1984* are hereby consequentially revoked.
